Instructions for Authors



The Albanian Journal of Natural and Technical Sciences (JNTS) of the Albanian Academy of Sciences publishes papers concerned with all aspects of natural and technical sciences. It particularly welcomes contributions that illustrate the unifying concepts of science with evidence, either observational or theoretical, from any relevant field.

Papers for the journal should be no more than 4,000 words in length. Please use font Times New Roman size 11.

You should receive an acknowledgement by email, or a receipt when delivered in person. Thereafter, the system will keep you informed of the process of your submission through refereeing, any revisions that are required, and a final decision.

Copyright assignment

Authors will be required to assign copyright in their paper to the Academy of Sciences of Albania. Copyright assignment is a condition of publication and papers will not be passed to the publisher for production unless copyright has been assigned. Please note where work is carried out by an author in their capacity as an employee of a Company or government, it may be the case that copyright is held by the Company or government. In this case it is important to ensure that someone with suitable authority within that Company or government signs the Copyright Assignment Form.

Author material archive policy

Please note that, unless specifically requested, the Academy of Sciences will dispose of all electronic material and hardcopy two months after publication. If you require the return of any of this material, you must inform the editorial office upon submission.

Offprints

A PDF offprint of the published article will be provided free of charge to the corresponding author, and may be distributed subject to the Publisher's terms and conditions. Paper offprints of the printed published article may be purchased if ordered via the method stipulated on the instructions that will accompany the proofs.

Manuscript preparation

Authors should aim to communicate ideas and information clearly and concisely, in language suitable for the moderate specialist. Papers in languages other than English are not accepted unless invited. When a paper has joint authorship, one author must accept responsibility for all correspondence; the full postal address, telephone and fax numbers, and e-mail address of the author who is to check proofs should be provided. Please submit your manuscript in an editable format such as .doc or .rtf.

Papers should conform to the following general layout:

Title page

This should include title, authors, institutions and a short running title. Authors should be aware that snappy titles are more likely to catch the eye of the reader than long dull titles. Thus the title should be concise but informative.

Abstract

The abstract is highly important as it may be reproduced elsewhere, e.g. on the Internet, and is all that many may see of your work. It should summarize the paper in a form that is intelligible in conjunction with the title. It should not include references. The abstract should be followed by up to ten keywords additional to those in the title identifying the subject matter for retrieval systems. *Subject matter*

The paper should be divided into sections under short headings, typically in the following order: Introduction, Materials and Methods, Results, Discussion. Except in systematic hierarchies, the hierarchy of headings should not exceed three. Names of genera and species should be italicised. Cite the author of species on first mention. Use SI units, and the appropriate symbols (mm, not millimetre; µm, not micron; s, not sec; Myr for million years). Avoid elaborate tables of original or derived data, long lists of species, etc. If such data are essential, include them as appendices.

References

We recommend the use of a tool such as <u>EndNote</u> or <u>Reference Manager</u> for reference management and formatting. In the text, give references in the following forms: 'Darwin (1859) said', 'Feynman (1972: 12)' where it is desired to refer to a specific page, and '(Altman, 2007)' where giving reference simply as authority for a statement. Note that names of joint authors are connected by 'and' in the text. When papers are by three or more authors, use *et al*.

The list of references must include all publications cited in the text but only these. Prior to submission, make certain that all references in the text agree with those in the references section, and that spelling is consistent throughout. In the list of references, titles of periodicals must be given in full, not abbreviated. For books, give the title, place of publication, name of publisher and indication of edition if not the first.

References should conform as exactly as possible to one of these four styles, according to the type of publication cited.

Other citations such as papers 'in press' may appear on the list but not papers 'submitted', 'in review' or 'in preparation'. A personal communication may be cited in the text but not in the reference list. Please give the initials and surnames for all authors of personal communications and unpublished data.

Where necessary use Albanian names and terms, but otherwise give foreign language references in ordinary English alphabetic form (but copy accents in French, German, Spanish, etc.), if necessary transliterating in accordance with a recognized scheme.

Tables

Keep tables as simple as possible, with few horizontal and, preferably, no vertical rules. When assembling complex tables and data matrices, consider the dimensions of the printed page: $160 \times 230 \text{ mm}$.

Illustrations

These normally include 1) half-tones reproduced from photographs, 2) black and white figures reproduced from drawings, and 3) diagrams. Use one consecutive set of Arabic numbers for all illustrations, and treat all as Figures, which should be numbered in the order in which they are cited in the text.

In the case that it is not possible to provide electronic versions, please supply photographic prints with labelling applied to a transparent overlay or to a photocopy.

Colour: It is essential when submitting colour figures that the legends apply equally well to both printed *greyscale* and *colour* versions. You can opt to pay for full colour. If your paper is accepted and you have opted for paid full colour, we will need a completed Colour Work Agreement Form. Colour illustrations will be published free of charge provided that the colour is deemed essential by the Editor for interpretation of the figure.

Black and white figures reproduced from drawings

These should be scanned at a minimum resolution of 800 dpi and supplied in TIFF format. JPEG, PowerPoint and doc images are not suitable for publication. If it is not possible to provide electronic versions, the figures supplied should be in black ink on white card or paper. Scale bars are the most satisfactory way of indicating magnification.

Diagrams

The author's electronic versions of diagrams should be supplied as vector format Encapsulated PostScript (EPS) files: diagrams or graphs will not reproduce well when your paper is put online unless they are in vector format.

Type legends for Figures in numerical order at the end of the manuscript. Where a 'key' is required for abbreviations used in more than one Figure, this should be included with the first such figure.

Authors wishing to use illustrations already published must obtain written permission from the copyright holder before submitting the manuscript. Good photograph copies or photocopies of figures rather than originals can be submitted.

Authors may be charged for alterations at proof stage (other than printer's errors) if they are numerous.

If the above guidelines and general layout are not followed the manuscript will be returned to the author.

Copyright

Authors receiving requests for permission to reproduce work published by the Academy should contact the Journal office for advice.

English Language

The authors must ensure that the level of English of the submitted ms is at an acceptable level for publication. Equally important is that scientific issues are presented simply and clearly. *AJNTS* recommends that the authors use the link of the publishers Wiley–Blackwell:
